By Air

Direct flights operate into Exeter International Airport from across the UK and Europe. Exeter Airport is situated six miles from the city centre and transport from the airport to the University Campus may be either by bus or by a short taxi journey.

By Coach/Bus

For all enquiries please call on 08717 818178, (0044 8717 818178 from overseas). Lines are open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Exeter Bus and Coach Station, Paris Street, Exeter, EX1 2JX, is the main bus station in Exeter and is about 1 mile from the Streatham Campus. Stagecoach is a local bus service around the city. The 'D' bus service runs from the city centre to Streatham Campus every 15 minutes during the day Monday – Saturday. By Train

The railway station closest to the University Campus is Exeter St. David's. This is served by main line routes. Once at St. David's you may take a taxi from the rank outside the station. <http://www.nationalrail.co.uk/>

If you would like to walk from the station to the campus (about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile), there is a quick and direct route although it is quite steep. (Allow about 15 to 20 minutes).

Leave the station via the main booking hall, and walk across the forecourt keeping to the right of the car parking area. You will meet Bonhay Road. Cross over at the zebra crossing. Turn left, and almost immediately right into a passageway called St. Clement's Lane. Follow this up the hill; it comes out on to St. David's Hill. Cross over and continue up the road opposite (Howell Road). You will then meet New North Road. Cross over at the zebra crossing, and turn left. The next major turning on the right is Streatham Drive. Take this, and fork left after a short distance (still called Streatham Drive). You will see a large map of the campus.

By Road

Exeter is easily reached by the M5 Motorway to the east and by the A30 to the west.

The University of Exeter Streatham Campus is approximately 30 minutes from the M5.

From the M5

Leave the M5 at Junction 29, signed Exeter Airport.

- At the traffic lights at the end of the motorway slip road, turn right onto the B3015, signed City Centre, and at the first roundabout turn right, signed Exeter Business Park.

- Go straight over at the next two roundabouts, signed Pinhoe, and join the Monkerton Link Road. At the traffic lights bear left onto the B3212, signed City Centre. Take the right-hand lane and at the second set of traffic lights turn right, signed University.
- Pass under the railway bridge (Polsloe Bridge), drive up the hill and at the fourth set of traffic lights turn right onto Mount Pleasant Road, signed University. (Henry's Bar is on the corner of this junction.)
- At the first roundabout take the second exit onto Union Road. Go straight over at the first set of traffic lights onto Prince of Wales Road. After a set of pedestrian crossing traffic lights the road curves to the left, continue along this road until you see the main **Streatham Drive Entrance** on your right. Use this entrance for the main car parks, the Forum and Great Hall, Northcott Theatre, Peter Chalk Centre, Xfi and Streatham Court, Holland Hall, Mardon Hall, Reed Hall and the Sports Park (see the [Streatham Campus map](#)).

From the East via A303/A30

- After the junction with the M5 (J29) follow the signs for Exeter Business Park. The route then follows the directions given under 'From the M5'.

From the West via the A30

If you are unfamiliar with Exeter or are travelling at peak times, when this route can be congested, we recommend that you join the M5 and follow the instructions from Junction 29.

- Alternatively, leave the A30 at the Dawlish and Marsh Barton turning. Turn left at the large roundabout into Alphington Spur (A377), which becomes Alphington Road. Continue on this road until the large Exe Bridges roundabout; Riverside Leisure Centre is on your left.
- Take the third exit (Bonhay Road), signed Exeter St David's station. After passing the station on your left, turn sharp right at a double roundabout onto St David's Hill.
- Turn left at the first mini roundabout and then left at the next set of traffic lights into New North Road. Take the second right into Streatham Drive and the **University's Streatham Drive entrance** is on your left. Use this entrance for the main car parks, the Forum and Great Hall, Northcott Theatre, Xfi, and Streatham Court, Holland Hall, Mardon Hall, Reed Hall, Peter Chalk and the Sports Park (see the [Streatham Campus map](#)).

Parking

Residential delegates (those who have booked accommodation), will have free parking and will be issued with a Residential Car Parking Permit when collect their room key. Please can these be clearly displayed in your vehicle with your car registration marked on it. You may park your car at the car park near to your accommodation or you may move your car around campus parking it in any of the campus car parks.

Day Delegates (who have not booked accommodation), must purchase a car parking ticket from the machines located near to the car parks on campus. The charges during weekdays are:

Per Hour	- 60p
½ Day	- £2.00
Full Day	- £3.00

There are no parking charges at weekends or after 6pm.
