Talk Title: Solving the proactive and reactive resource-constrained project scheduling problem

Erik Demeulemeester is Professor in the Research Center for Operations Management at the KU Leuven. He earned the degree of business engineering (field of Management Informatics) in 1987, the degree of Master of Business Administration in 1988 and a PhD in 1992, all from the KU Leuven.

She received her Ph.D. in Mechanical Engineering and Operations Management from Aristotle University of Thessaloniki (AUTH) in Greece. She holds a Diploma in Mechanical Engineering from AUTH. Before joining KLU she worked as a Postdoctoral Research Fellow at the Social Innovation Centre at INSEAD, France.

Mauricio G. C. Resende is an Affiliate Professor of Industrial and Systems Engineering at the University of Washington. He is most known for his work with metaheuristics, in particular GRASP (greedy randomised adaptive search procedures) and BRKGA (biased random-key genetic algorithms), as well as for his work with interior point methods for linear programming and network flows.
