

## Poster Guidelines

### Content Requirements:

- Title
- Authors and collaborators
- Problem objectives/ research question/ hypotheses
- Background/ motivation/ mapping on to theory or practice
- Methods
- Results to date/ expected contribution to knowledge or organisation

### Size Requirements:

- A1 or A0 size (boards are 2 metres high x one metre wide; portrait orientation for A0)
- Select a text size and pictures/charts that are readable from a distance of 3 feet.

### Author responsibilities

- Bring a printed copy of the poster(s) and poster fasteners (such as Velcro).

In addition to presenting a poster at the workshop ALL poster authors must present a two-minute 'elevator pitch' in the Practitioner and Researcher poster competition to argue why their poster deserves the title of SW20's best poster.

1. For posters of simulation projects the suggested format is to briefly outline:
  - a. the background to the project
  - b. challenges in the use of simulation
  - c. impact
2. For posters of simulation research the suggested format is to briefly outline:
  - a. background to the research
  - b. methodology
  - c. key results
3. For simulation projects that are currently a work in progress authors may wish to outline the project background and key challenges in the use of simulation only.
4. For simulation research that is currently a work in progress authors may wish to outline the expected contribution or preliminary results.
