


## Information for Presenters

### The outline process for presenters at OR63



#### 1. Submit your summary

To be considered for the conference programme, please submit a title and summary of up to 300 words maximum through the link to the submission system on the conference website **by 25 June**:

Remember, the summary should be phrased in a way to attract people to your presentation.

#### 2. Submission reviewed.

You will be informed following the submission deadline if your summary has been accepted, along with your allocated slot on the programme.

#### 3. Register to attend the conference

In order to present at the conference, all presenters must register and pay to attend. Following the submission deadline and review of summaries, all submissions accepted onto the conference programme will be given a deadline by which to register. Any submissions without a registered presenter by this deadline will be removed from the programme.

#### **4. Prepare for your presentation**

- **Each presentation will be allocated approx 15-20 minutes on the programme** (keynote presentations will be allocated longer). As the conference is taking place virtually, all presentations will take place through an online platform. You will be provided with all the information and onboarding you need to present through this platform.
- **Your presentation will form part of a thematic stream.** It will be scheduled on the programme within a session that is 60 - 90 minutes long, alongside other presentations of the same theme. There will be opportunity for attendees to ask questions, with time allocated to Q&A within the session.
- **A session Chair will be appointed for each session.** The role of the session Chair is to introduce each paper, ensure that papers run to time and manage the questions from the audience.
